Comments: Transfer of documents to state archives in Lithuania is regulated by the Law on Documents and Archives (<a href="http://www3.lrs.lt/pls/inter3/dokpaieska.showdoc-e?p-id=426255&p-query=&p-tr2=2">http://www3.lrs.lt/pls/inter3/dokpaieska.showdoc-e?p-id=426255&p-query=&p-tr2=2</a>). The part 1 of the article 15 of Law on Documents and Archives of the Republic of Lithuania determines that:



- 1. Activity documents of permanent retention shall be transferred to state archives by the Seimas of the Republic of Lithuania, the President of the Republic, institutions and agencies established by them, the Government of the Republic of Lithuania, courts, the Bank of Lithuania, ministries and government agencies, law-enforcement and armed-forces institutions and agencies, other central and territorial entities of state administration and municipal administration, agencies and enterprises providing public services, in the conduct of activities of which permanent retention documents are accumulated. A list of state and municipal institutions, agencies and enterprises which transfer documents to state archives shall be approved by the Chief Archivist of Lithuania.
- 2. <u>State and municipal institutions, agencies and enterprises may store permanent retention documents for up to 20 years after the entry of such documents into registration documents. During this period institutions, agencies or enterprises must transfer documents to state archives for permanent retention.</u>
- \* Only permanently stored documents of the Mobilisation Department under the Ministry of National Defence as well as Office of the Lithuanian Armed Forces are transferred to the Lithuanian state archives. Documents of other units of Lithuanian Republic National Defense system are preserved in the National Defence Archives under the Ministry of National Defence (the archives is responsible for the acquisition, preservation etc.).

The article 7 of Law on State Secrets and Official Secrets of the Republic of Lithuania determines the <u>List of Categories of Information to be Classified</u> (the part 1 of the article 7 concerns the categories of a state secrets as well as part 2 of the article 7 concerns the categories of an official secret (for example, detailed data on programmes and plans of production of weapons, firearms, explosives, combat equipment, special means, the technical equipment of operational investigative activities etc).

Comments: The part 2 of the article 1 of Law on State Secrets and Official Secrets of the Republic of Lithuania determines the following: The classified information of foreign states, the European Union or international organisations released to the Republic of Lithuania shall be stored and used in accordance with the procedure laid down by international treaties of the Republic of Lithuania, decisions of international organisations based on these treaties and implementing them, legal acts of the European Union and this Law. In the cases when international treaties of the Republic of



Lithuania and/or decisions of international organisations based on the treaties and/or implementing them and legal acts of the European Union set other requirements for the storage and use of classified information of foreign states or international organisations than specified in this Law, the provisions of the international treaties and/or decisions of international organisations based on the treaties and/or implementing them and legal acts of the European Union shall apply.

Comments: The part 2 of the article 1 of Law on State Secrets and Official Secrets of the Republic of Lithuania determines the following: The classified information of foreign states, the European Union or international organisations released to the Republic of Lithuania shall be stored and used in accordance with the procedure laid down by international treaties of the Republic of Lithuania, decisions of international organisations based on these treaties and implementing them, legal acts of the European Union and this Law. In the cases when international treaties of the Republic of Lithuania and/or decisions of international organisations based on the treaties and/or implementing them and legal acts of the European Union set other requirements for the storage and use of classified information of foreign states or international organisations than specified in this Law, the provisions of the international treaties and/or decisions of international



organisations based on the treaties and/or implementing them and legal acts of the European Union shall apply.
